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Comparative grammar is the branch of linguistics primarily concerned with the analysis and comparison of the grammatical structures of related languages or dialects. The term comparative grammar was commonly used by 19th-century philologists .

A comparative is the form of adjective or adverb used to compare two things. Examples of Comparatives Here are some examples of comparatives (comparatives shaded): Mark is taller. (taller = comparative of the adjective tall) Mark listens more attentively these days. (more attentively = comparative of the adverb attentively)

Comparative adjectives. Comparative adjectives are used to compare differences between the two objects they modify (larger, smaller, faster, higher). They are used in sentences where two nouns are compared, in this pattern: Noun (subject) + verb + comparative adjective + than + noun (object).

Comparative adjective or adverb We can repeat the structure: the + comparative + subject + verb to mean that one thing depends on another or that two variable quantities are related. How do we Make Comparative Adverbs? There are three basic ways to make or "form" a comparative adverb: 1. One-syllable adverbs: add -er. If an adverb has only one syllable, we usually just add -er to make it comparative: fast → faster. Here are some examples:
